Seasonal Flu

At this time, we do not have vaccine for the seasonal flu for adults. For babies and children ages 6 months through 35 months we have the seasonal flu shot available. No appointment is needed for this seasonal flu shot.

H1N1 Flu

We do not have H1N1 flu vaccine of any kind that is appropriate for pregnant women

The H1N1 Flu Shot is available for persons in these groups:

1. Age 3 thru 18 with a chronic illness
2. Adults thru age 64 ONLY IF they are daily caregivers for babies less than 6 months of age. These adults may have chronic illness and still be appropriate to receive this H1N1 flu shot.
