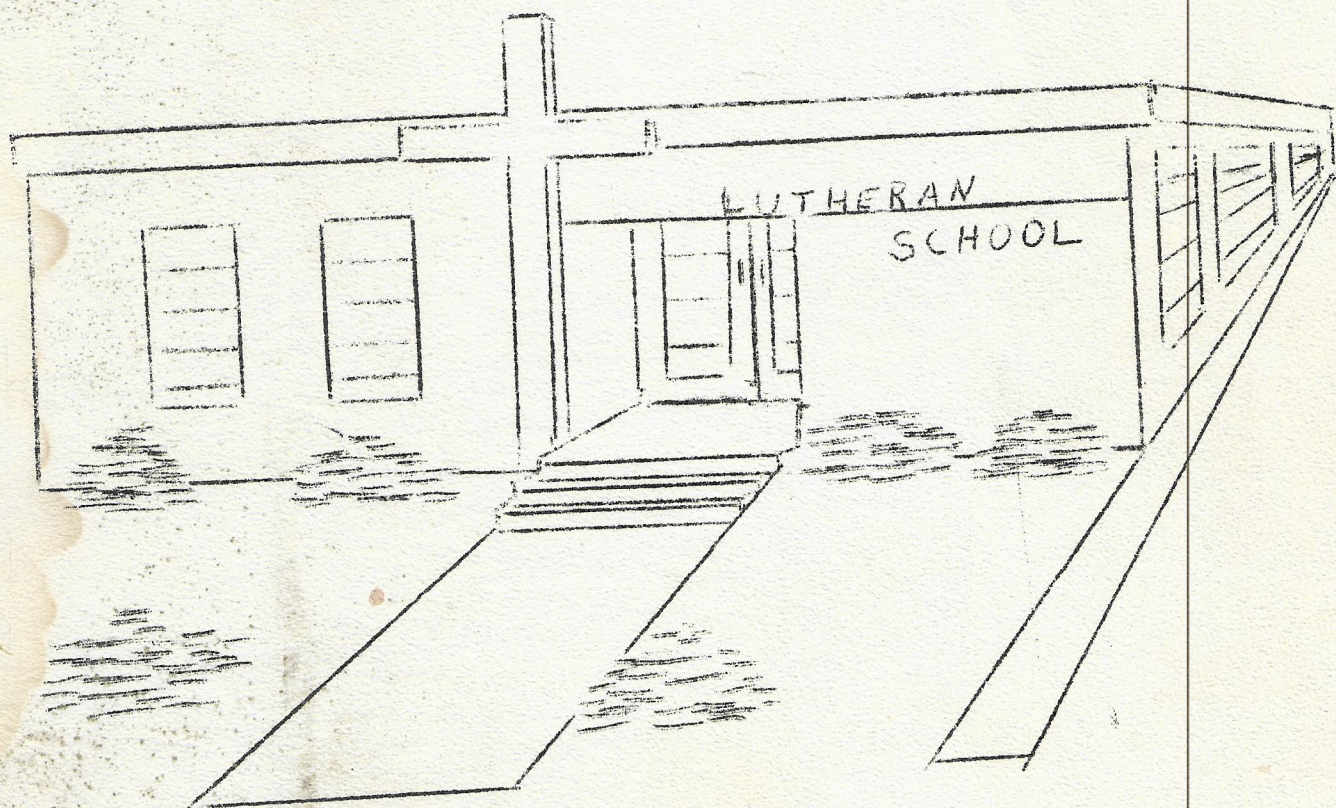


CLASS of 1963

Larry Eckhoff: The Morons in Utah had used this way of bringing water to the land.

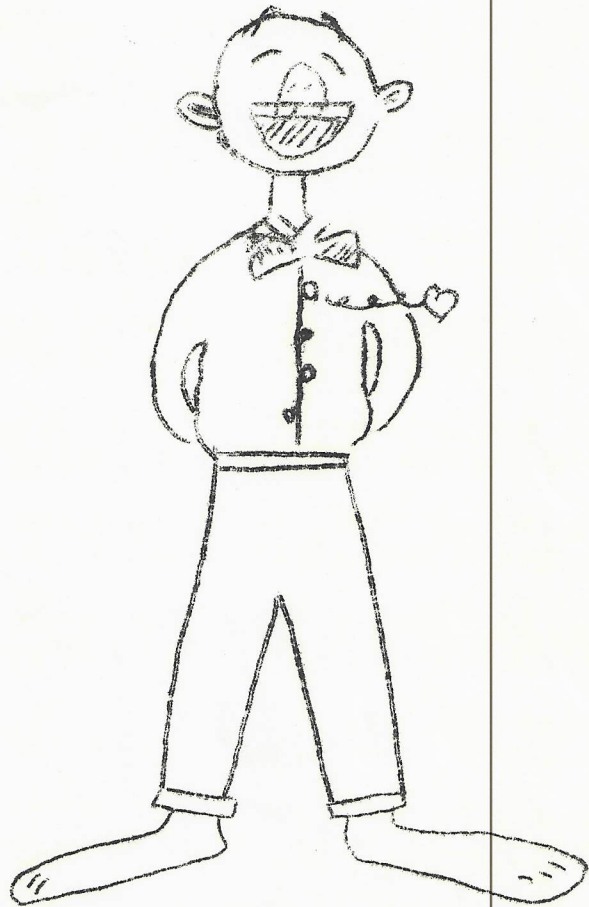
Mr. Fadler: Donald Eckhoff, please close your book.
