Our contribution to the March of Dimes this year was \$51.30.

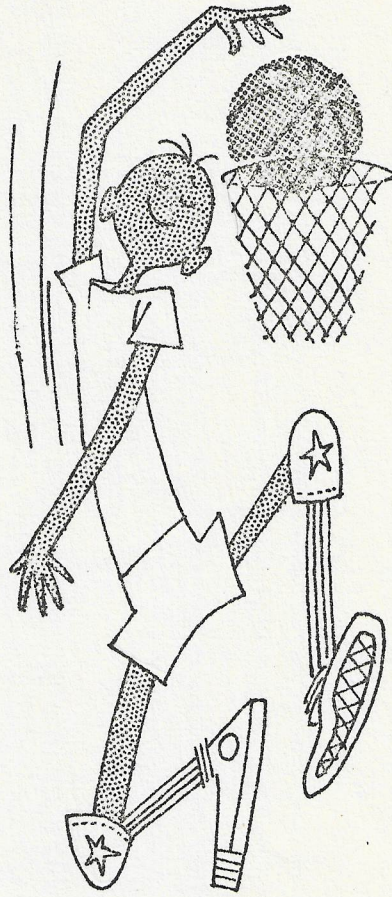
STAMPS
