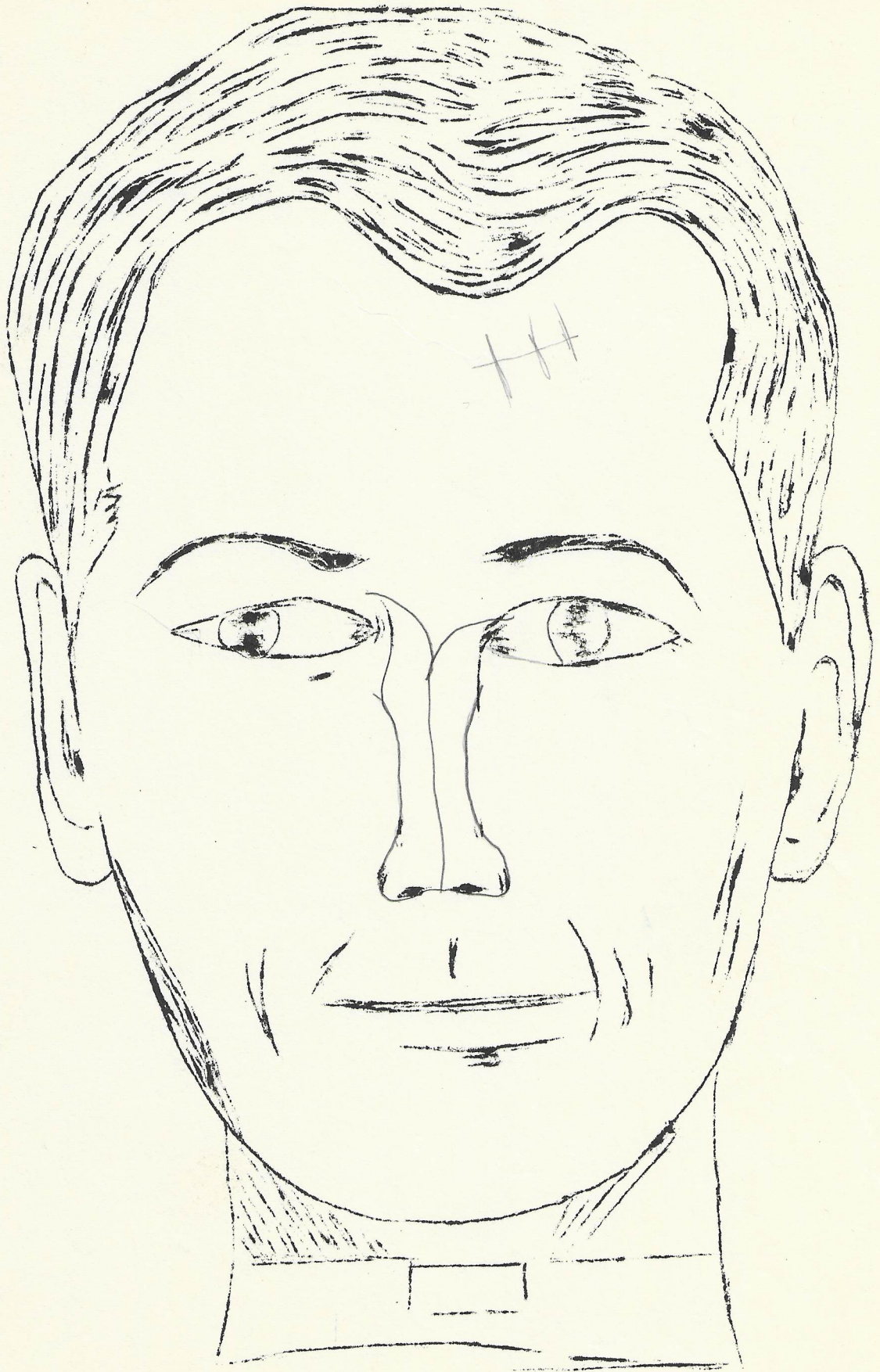

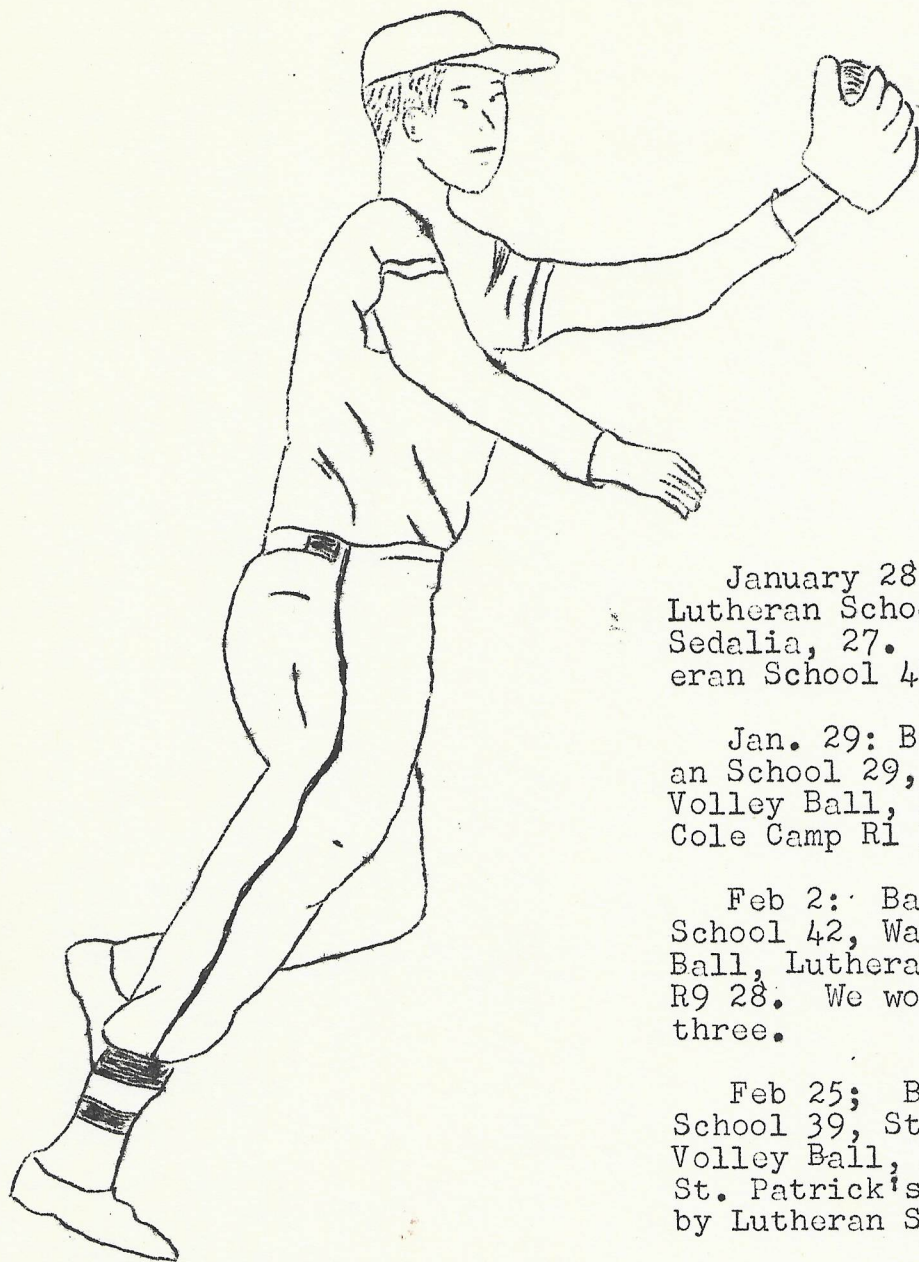

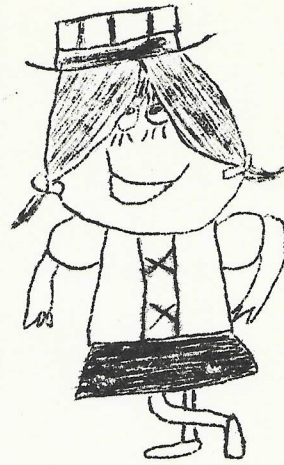
STAMPS: The total amount of sales for U.S. Saving Stamps was \$479.15. This included twenty-two bonds.
