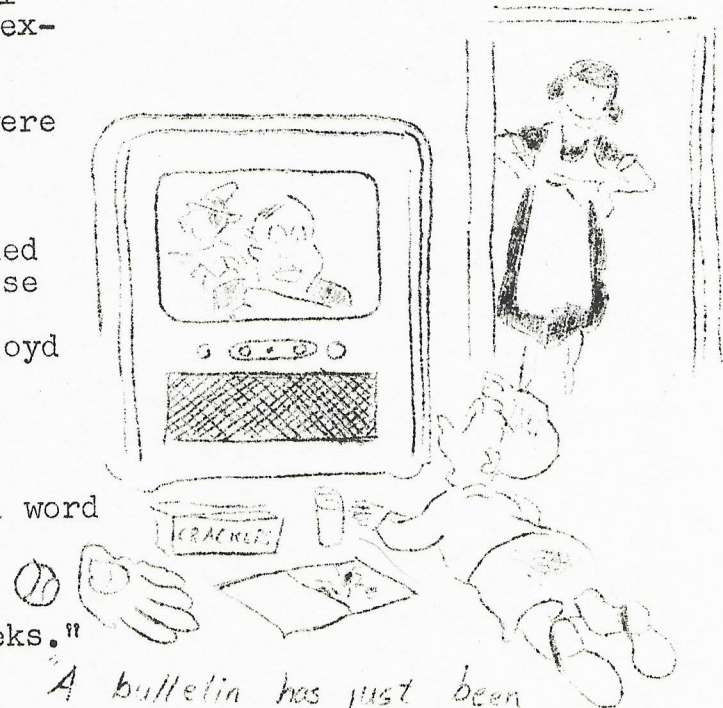

During January and February Honey Creek defeated Cole Camp twice and Stover was the victor in another game.

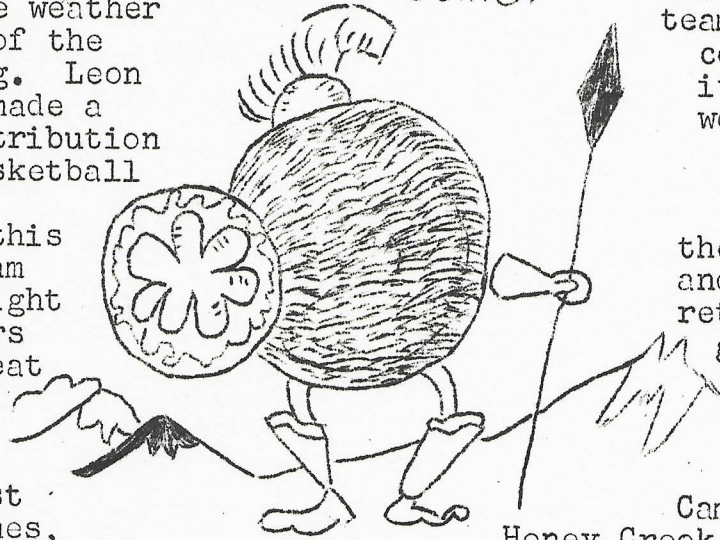

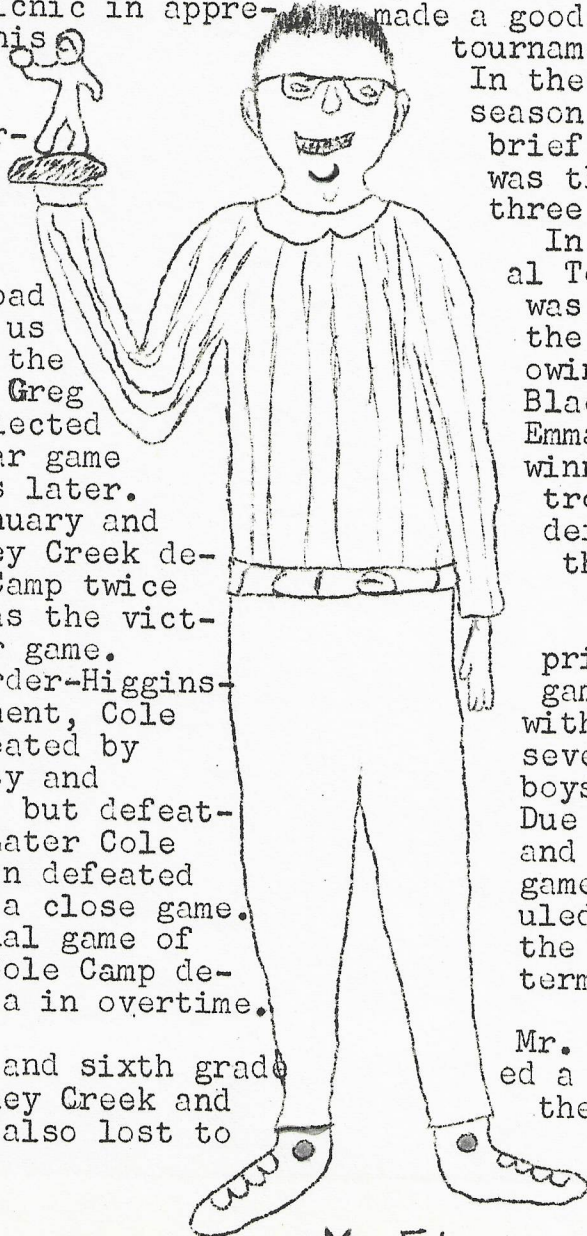
