A Compliment?

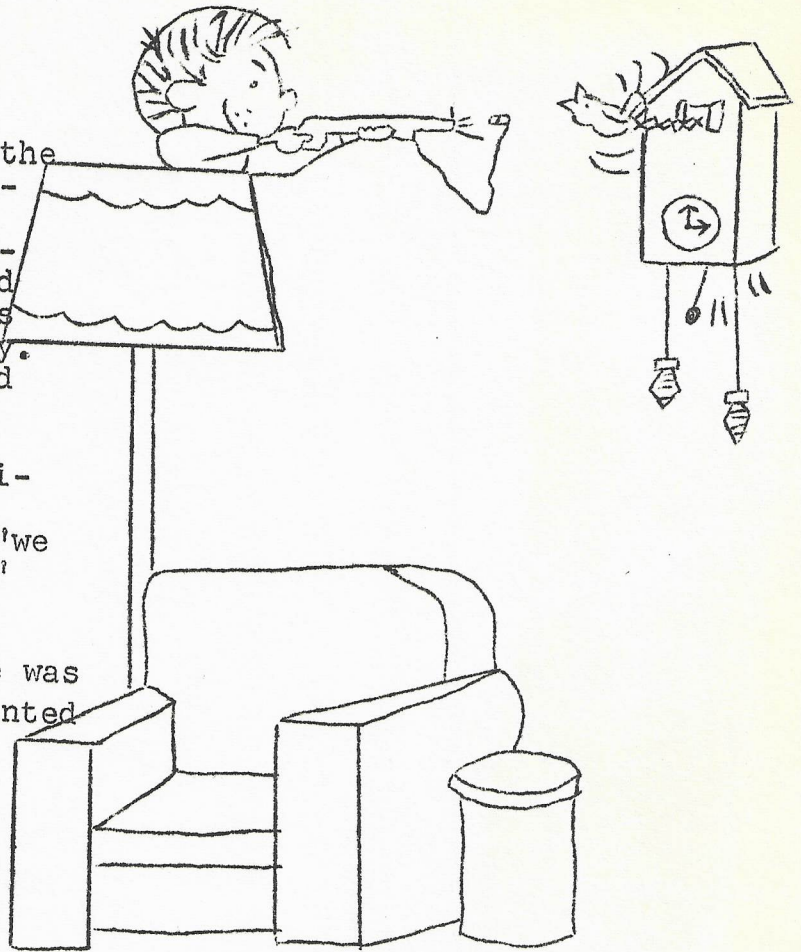
