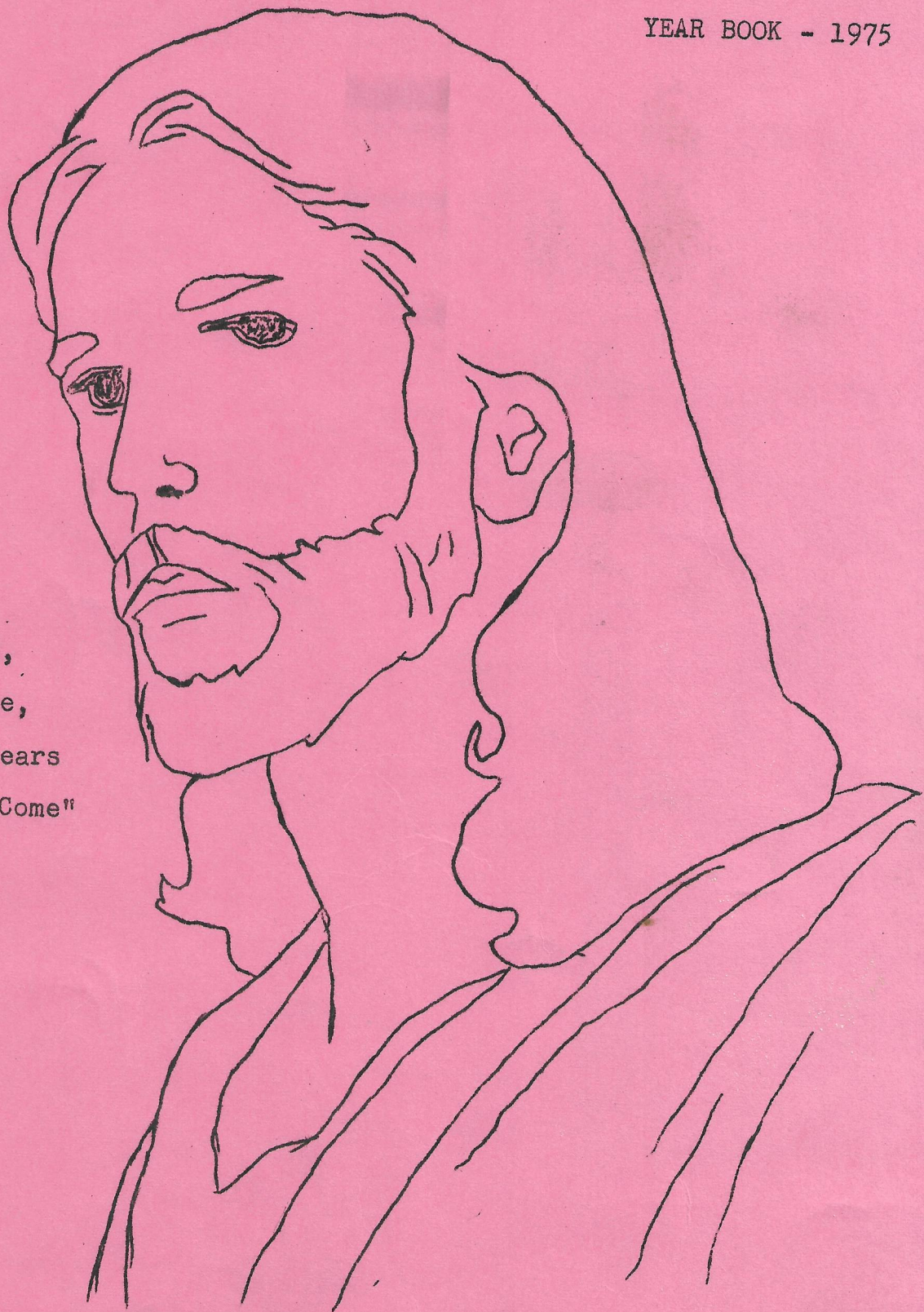

All grades enjoy many kinds of games during the day's recesses. Mrs. Heisterberg and Mrs. Hesse do their share of coaching and umpiring.

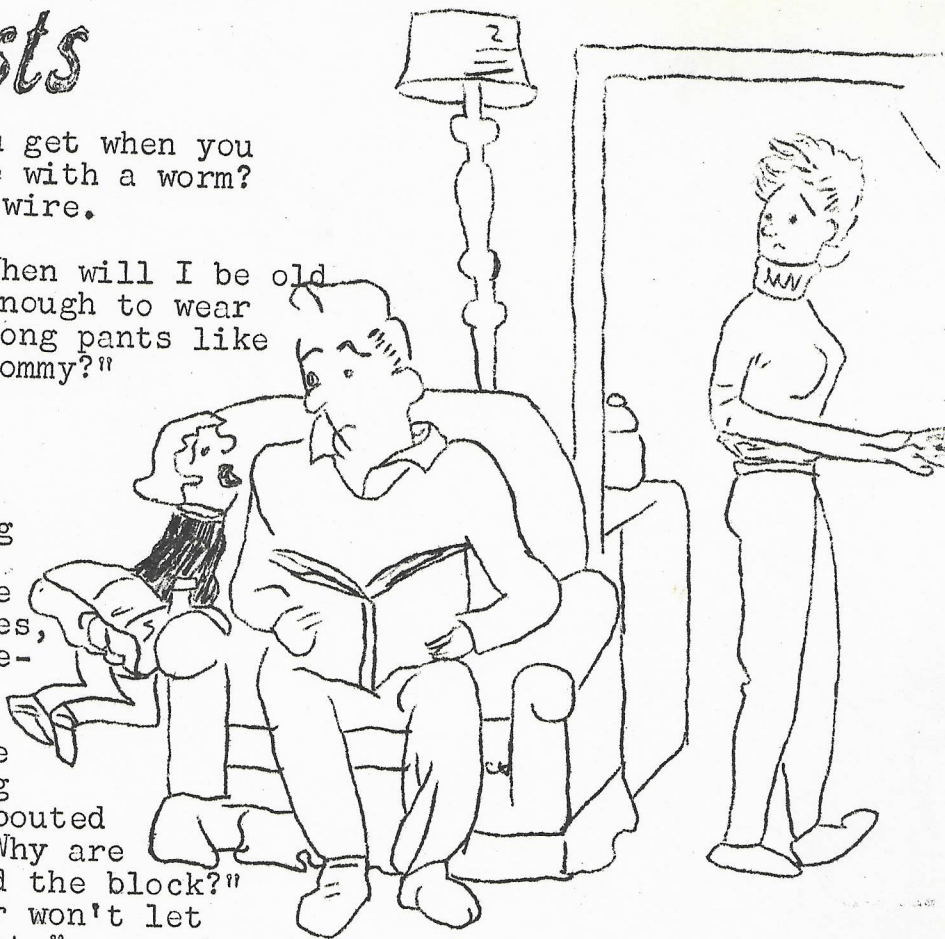
