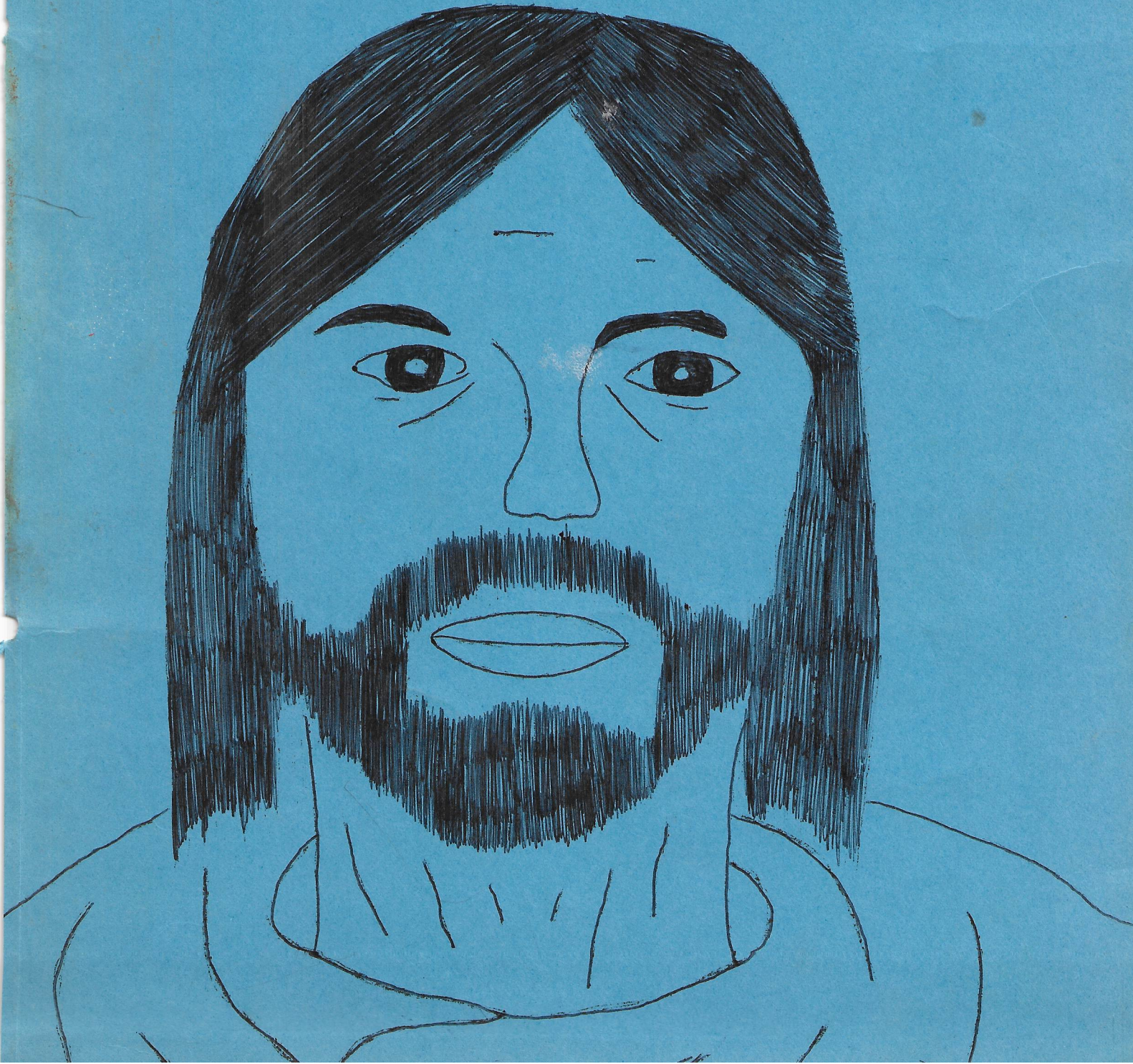

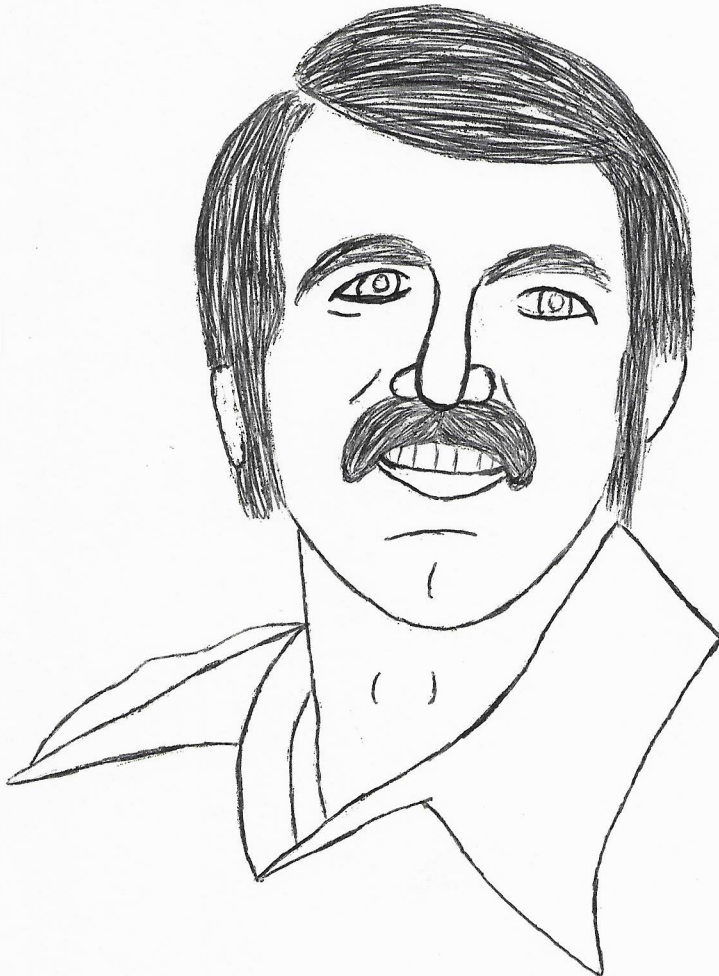

School Picnic

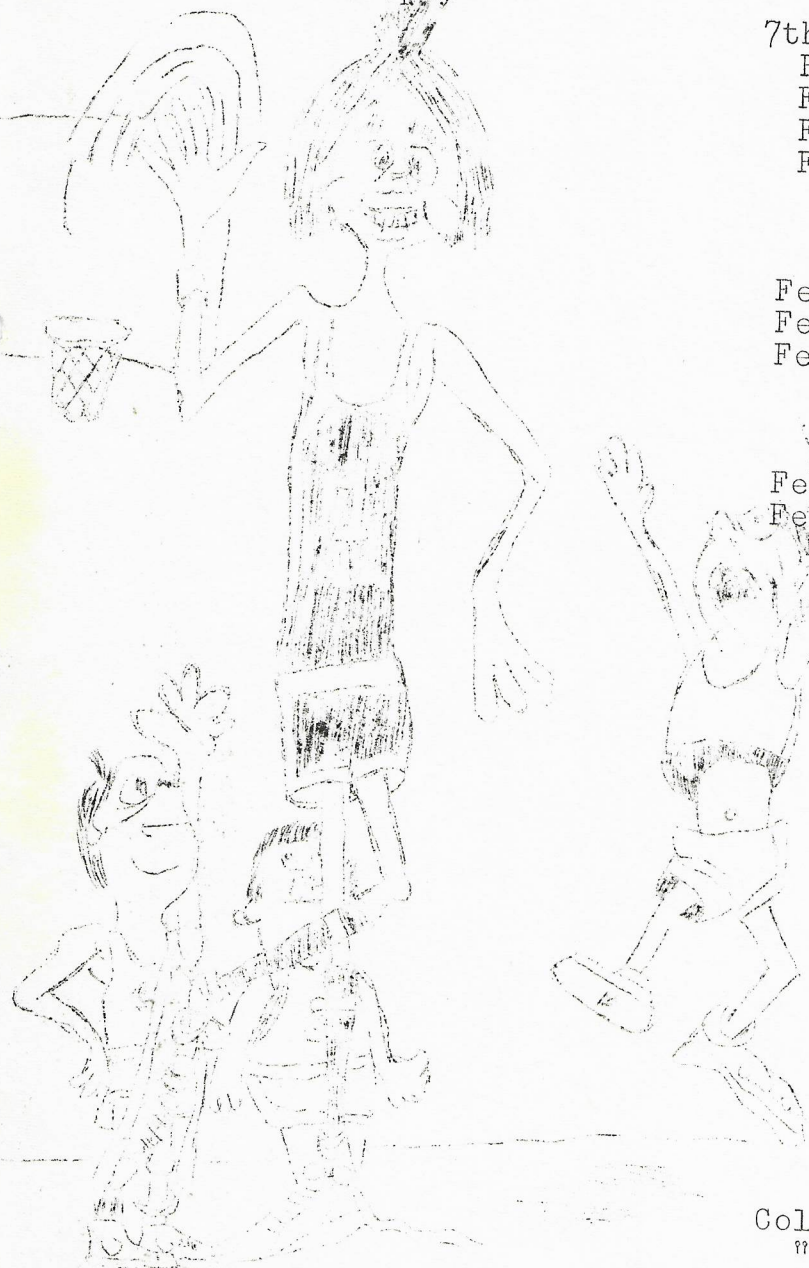

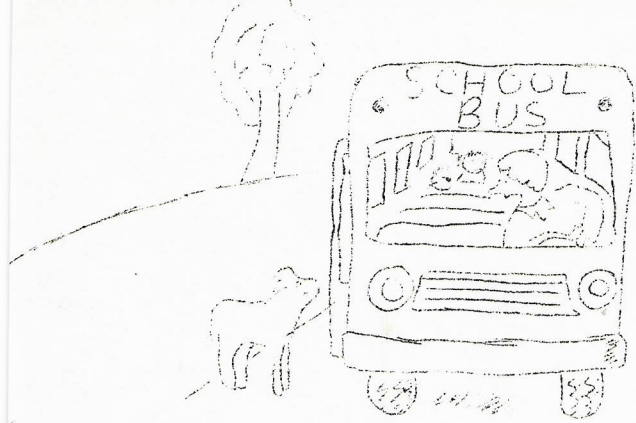
