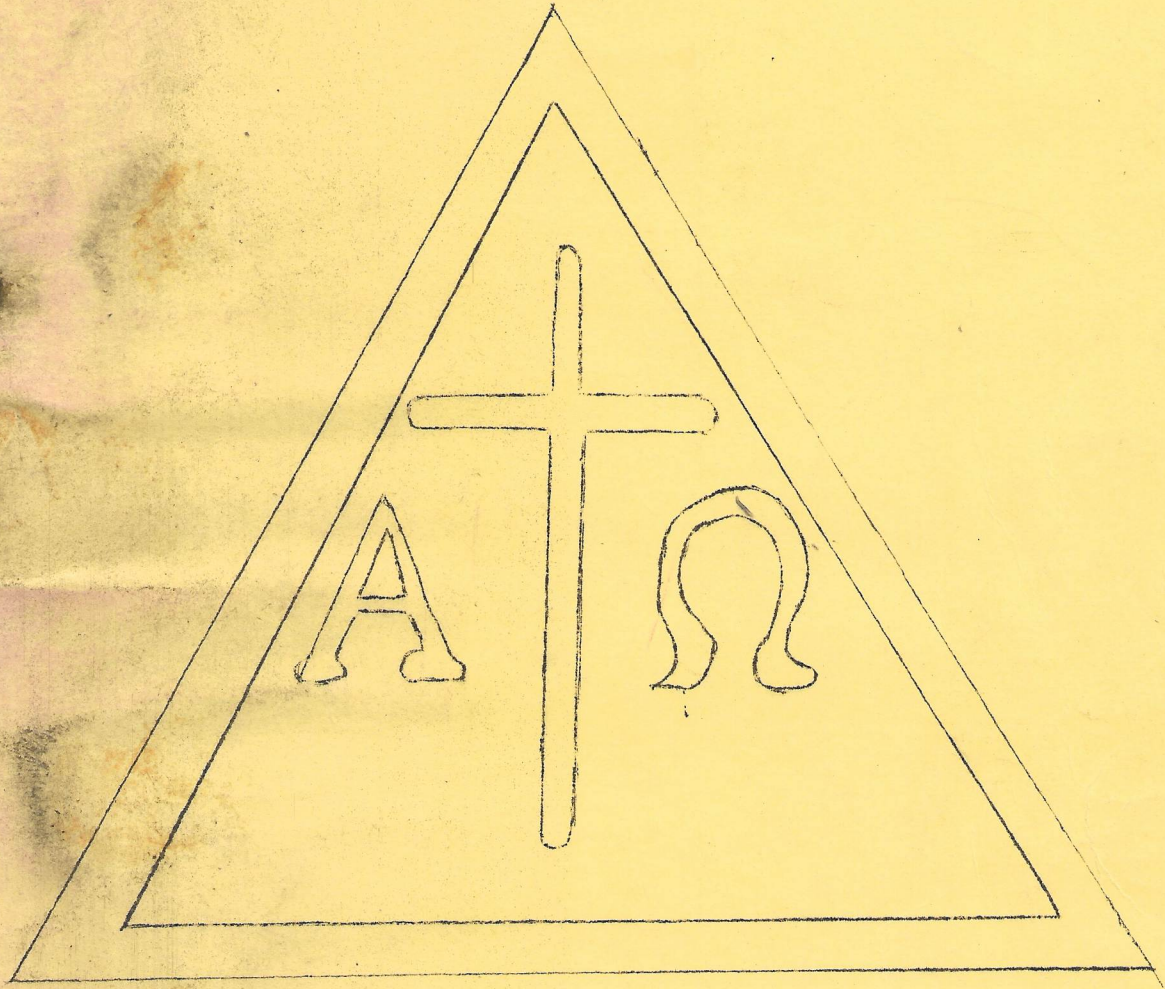

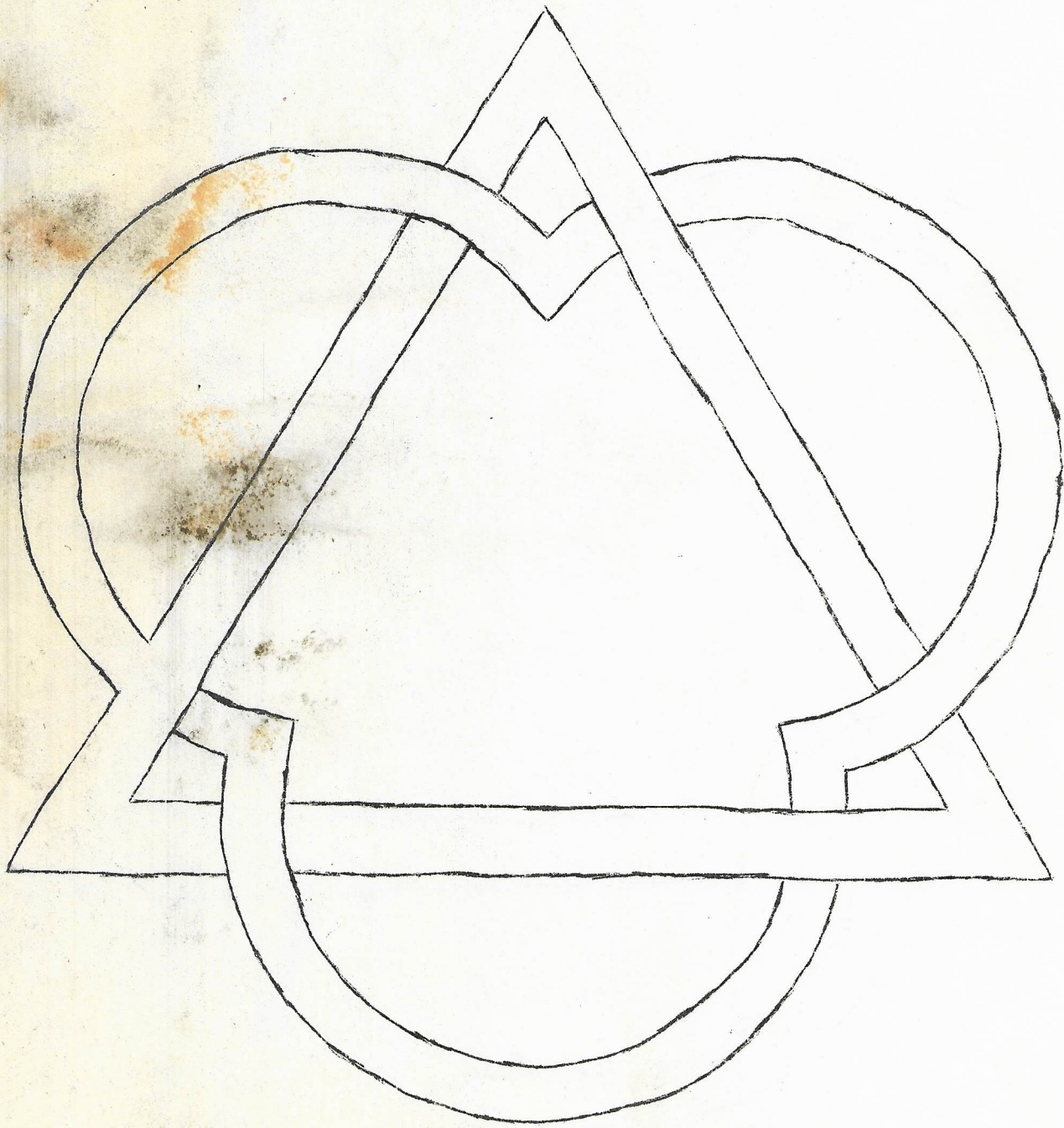

Our whole class knows a special thank-you goes to our parents who had to do a lot of things for us the last fourteen years and will have to do more the next few years.

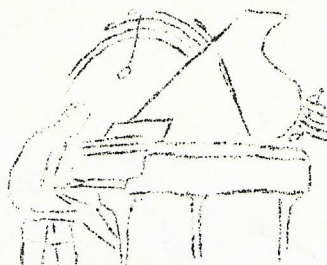
I also would like to thank Pastor Wagoner for his inspiring words. I'm sure everyone present will remember them for years to come.
