We stopped at the Bozo Bum Studio, where we found Jana Heimsoth


as a famous model and Gayle Heimsoth as the photographer.



off on our journey back to earth.




This year we collected Campbell's soup labels. All total we collected about 4,400.


This year the total amount of money earned from the Church Extension Stamps was approximately \$1,000.00.




