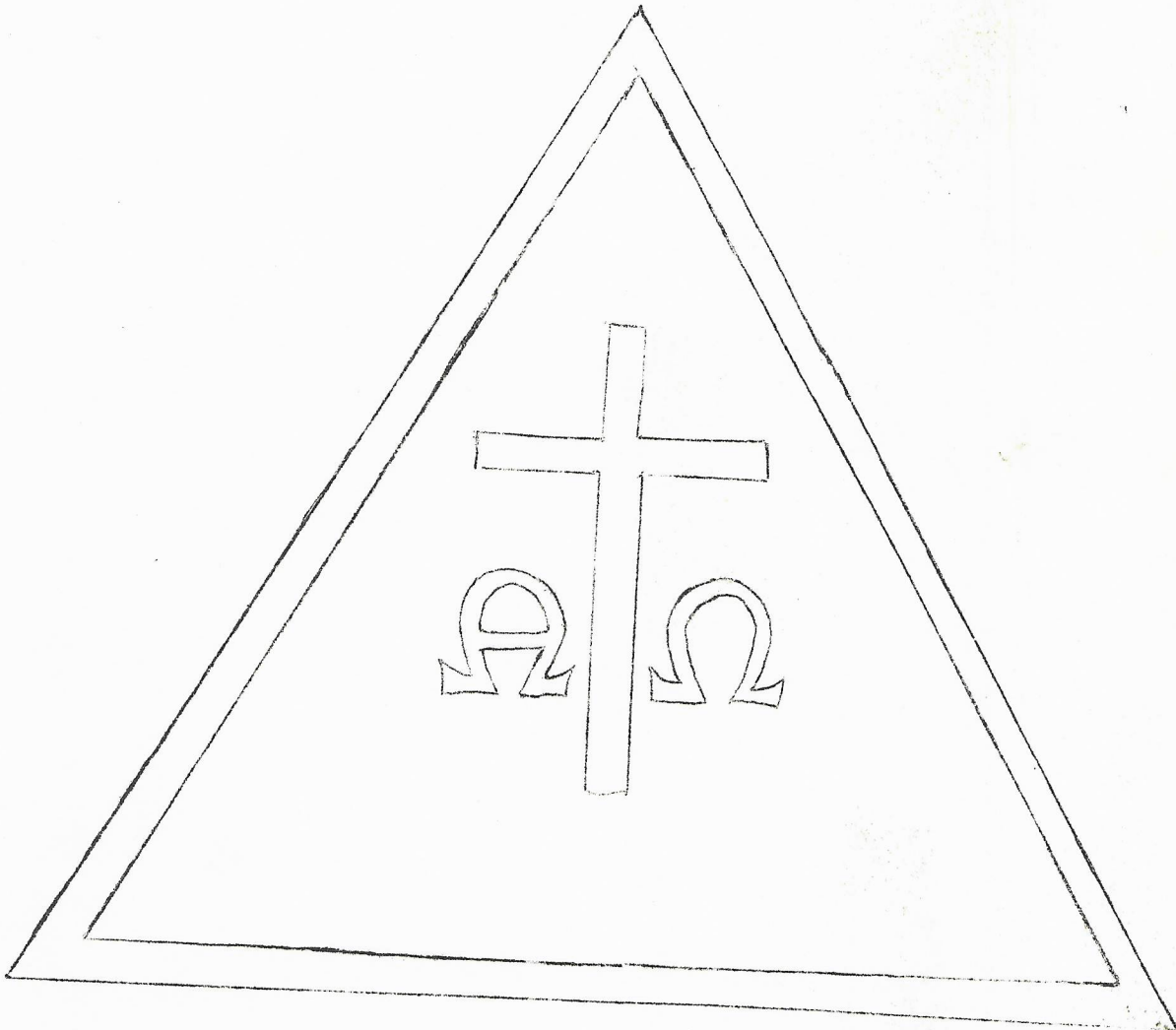

Finally, we want to thank Rev. Rolland Nothwehr for being our guest speaker and giving us that inspiring message.

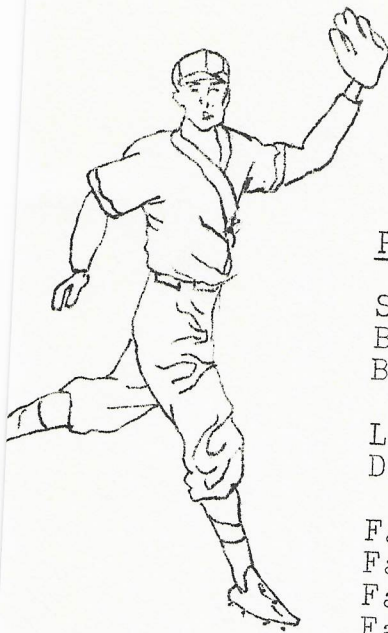

As we went on, we saw Bruce Lange on the Andromeda Galaxy trying to catch his pet meteorites. After a short visit with him, we continued on.

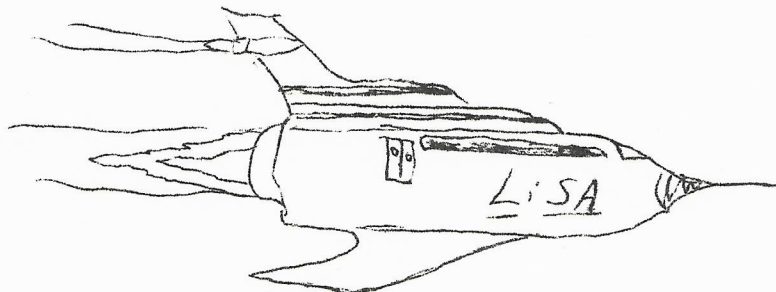
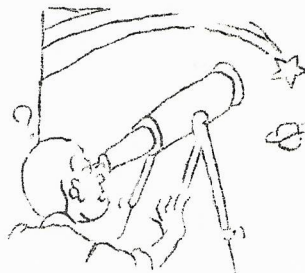
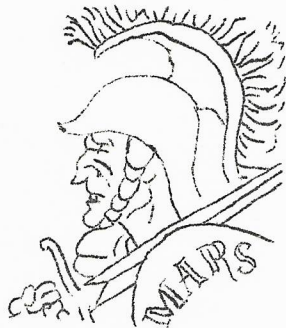

Grades 1-8 held their Christmas Parties December 23. Gifts were exchanged, and refreshments were enjoyed by all.

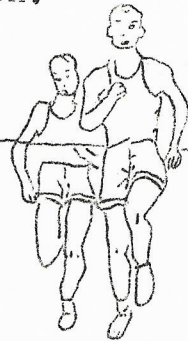
Grades 1-8 enjoyed a Valentine Party February 12. Valentines were exchanged, and refreshments were enjoyed by all.

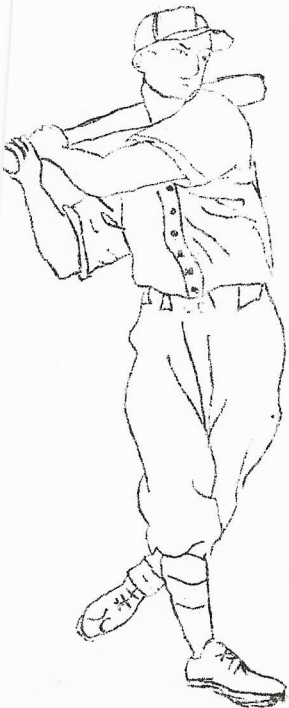
