After the islands, we traveled to Japan to fill up with gas. There Neil Harms was looking for a gas leak with a candle. We left quickly and got gas at a different station.

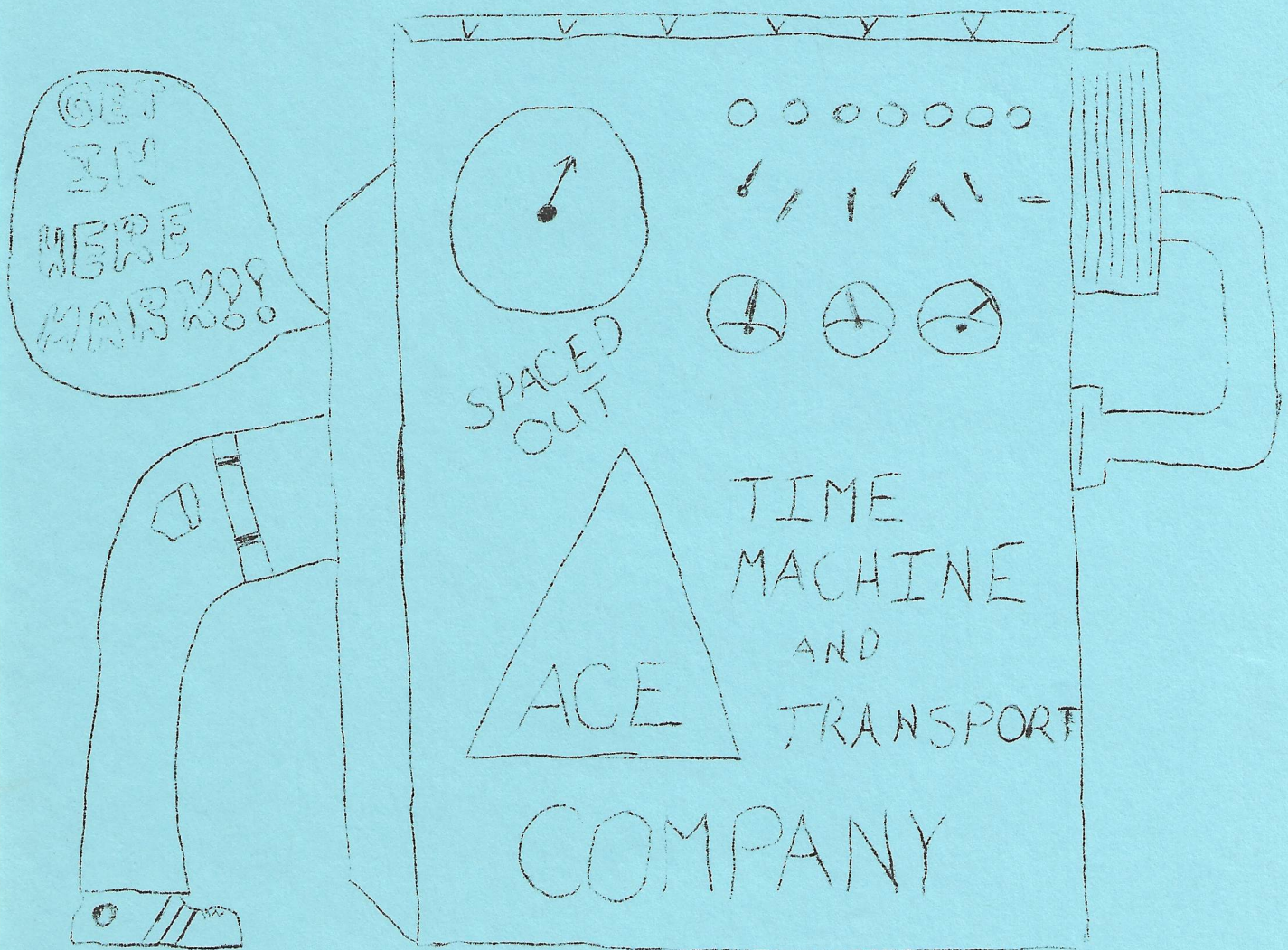
On the way back we found Barbara Holtzen as a mermaid schoolmarm teaching the mer-children how to hunt shellfish.

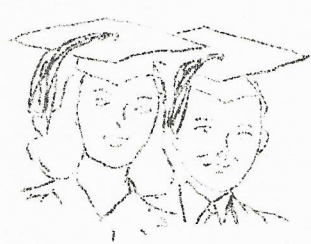
