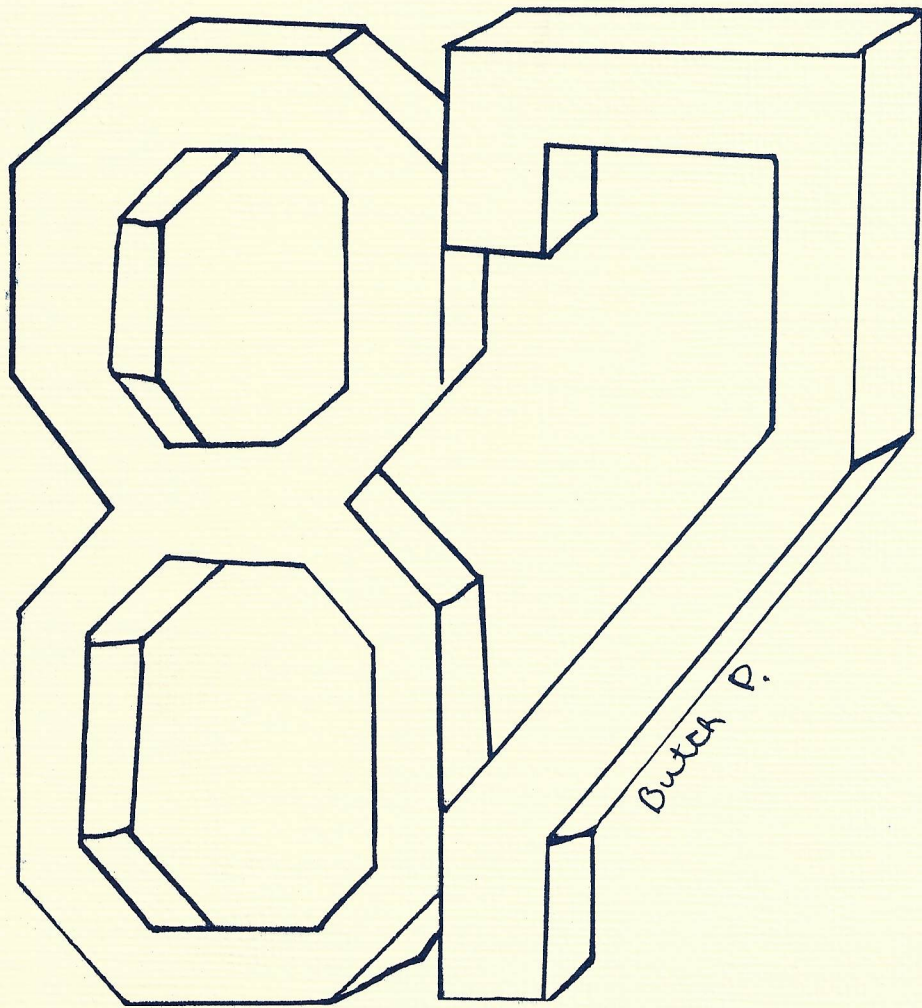

MAY GOD GRANT MRS. BAUER HIS RICHEST BLESSINGS.

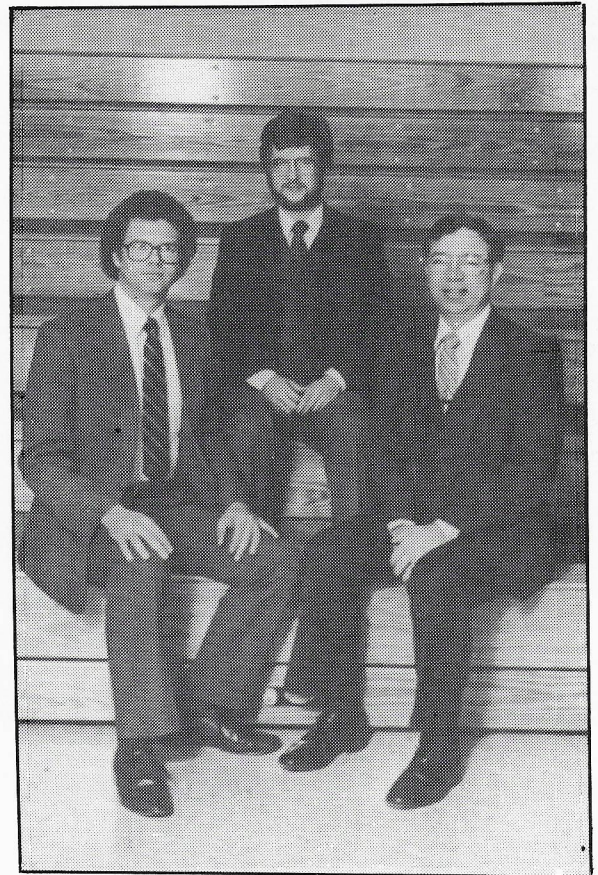
