

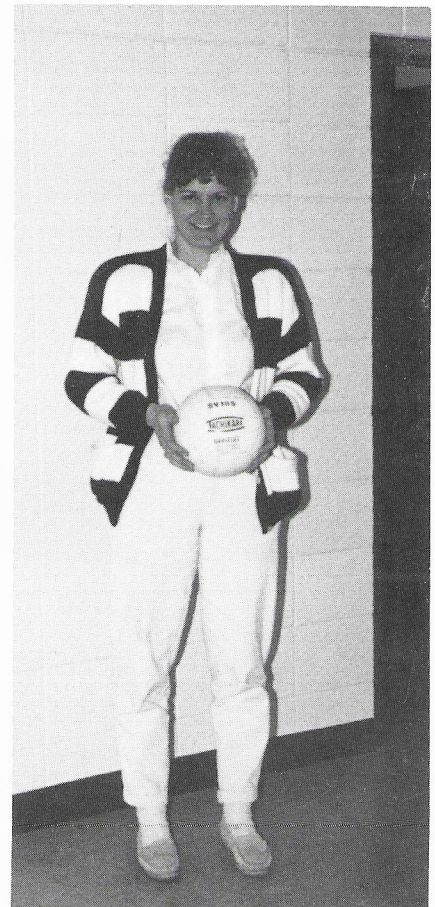
DEDICATION

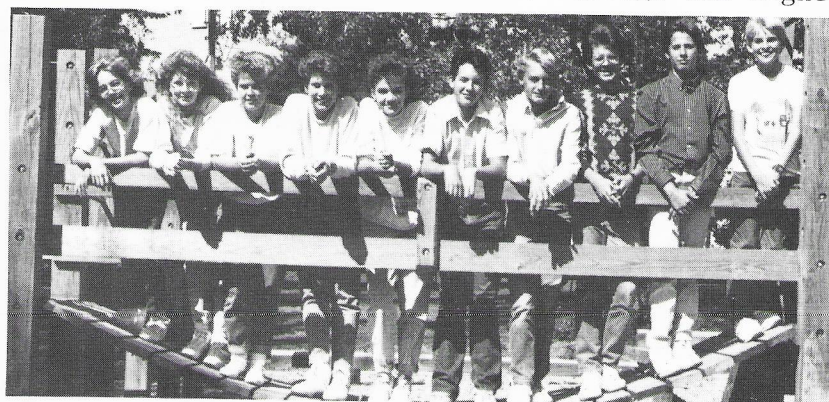
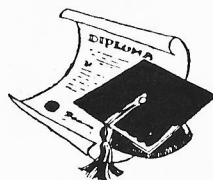
CLASS PROPHECY

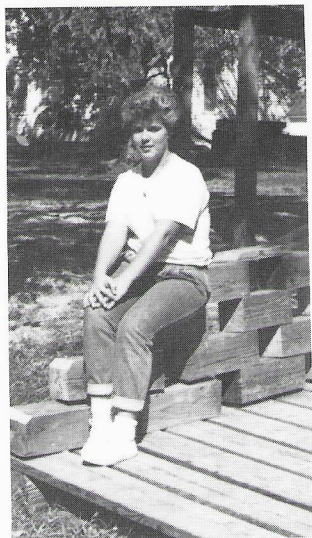

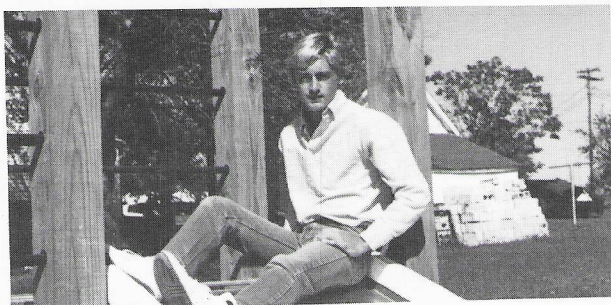
It is New Year's Eve and we now await the arrival of our last guest. Finally our guests arrive. even Mr. Bauer! And we party through the night and into 2021.
